Dear Friends.

Two weeks after the days we spent together in Hiroshima, I am writing this letter - also on behalf of the Steering Committee who organized our event, composed by the Abu Dhabi Forum for Peace, the Pontifical Academy for Life, the Chief Rabbinate of Israel's Commission for *Interreligious Relations*, and *Religions for Peace Japan* – to extend to you all my deep gratitude.

The joint signature of the Rome Call for AI Ethics by representatives of your stature is of historical significance.

We showed the world that all Religions are willing and capable to work and commit together on crucial issues for humanity, such as the ethical development of AI. Furthermore, we reaffirmed that Religions are protagonists of the public debate, especially when it comes to ensuring that technological development be used for the good of mankind, while protecting the human dignity of each individual as well as our common home.
